### **Biographical Sketch**

Herman "Hy" Rudin (b. October 30, 1906, Rochester, NY; d. February 17, 1977, Rochester, NY), violinist and violist, enjoyed a lifetime affiliation with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, initially as orchestral player (first violin, 1923-76) and later as administrator. His administrative roles with the RPO were those of Librarian and also Personnel Manager; in addition, he was often called upon to conduct during rehearsals while the appointed music director took a break. In the 1920s, he had been a member of Eugene Goossens' conducting class in Rochester. At that time his proven abilities, dedication, and personal integrity won him praise from Maestro Goossens, who wrote the following of Mr. Rudin in a letter of recommendation: "Personally, I have no hesitation in commending him as an individual in the highest possible terms." (From a handwritten letter of recommendation signed in Eugene Goossens' hand, March 29th, [1926?]. Herman Rudin Collection, Box 8, Folder 12.)

Mr. Rudin composed several original works for orchestra and also made transcriptions and arrangements of works by other composers. Between 1933 and 1947, six of his compositions were performed under the auspices of the annual Festivals of American Music at the Eastman School of Music; several of his works were also premiered and performed by the RPO.

Mr. Rudin died on February 17, 1977; at the time, he was survived by his wife, Sophie (*née* Caplan) (1908–1995), and their two children.

### **Provenance**

The Herman Rudin Collection was the gift of Herman Rudin's daughter and son, respectively, Mrs. Ann Carol Goldberg (Rochester, New York) and Mr. N. Arthur Rudin (St. Petersburg, Florida), and was received by the Sibley Music Library in July 2005.

#### **Scope and Content**

The Herman Rudin Collection is comprised of a substantial body of documents chronicling Herman Rudin's musical life, most tangibly in the manuscripts of orchestral works, represented in scores and parts. The collection also reflects in a substantive way the history of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra across a 50-year span, particularly in the rich assembly of photographs that capture the assembled orchestra, its conductors and guest artists, and milestone events.

### **Restrictions on Use**

No restrictions have been placed on use of the collection other than those imposed by the United States Copyright Law and its revisions. For any holdings demonstrably protected by copyright, such as the original manuscripts of Herman Rudin, the written consent of the copyright holders will be required before any reproductions in any form will be granted.

#### **Associations**

The Herman Rudin Collection represents a significant resource among the Ruth T. Watanabe Special Collections' substantial body of archival materials documenting the musical legacy of the community of Rochester. Other resources treating specifically the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and its companion ensemble, the Rochester Civic Orchestra, are the Rochester Philharmonic, Inc., Scrapbooks; the Civic Music Association Scrapbooks; and the RPO Press Releases. The RPO is also represented in the professional papers of those Eastman School faculty members who were RPO members, including John P. Celentano, Eileen Malone, and Verne Reynolds. Another notable RPO association lies in the manuscript collection of Kenneth Lee Richmond, the RPO's first full-time librarian and a local composer, arranger, and music copyist.

Additionally, the department holds the photographic archive of Alexander Leventon, who served as concertmaster of the Rochester Philharmonic (1923–1944) while also working as a professional photographer. The Alexander Leventon Collection preserves dozens of Leventon's negatives and photographs, which are primarily portraits of musicians associated with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and the Eastman School of Music. The department's other

prominent photographic collections include the David James Collection, the Gannett Photographs, the Ottolenghi-Clivio Collection, the Hal Schuler Collection, and the Louis Ouzer Archive; these as well as the Alexander Leventon Collection have been indexed in a searchable Iconography database that is accessible from the department's home page.

# DESCRIPTION OF SERIES

The Herman Rudin Collection is subdivided into four series, which are further subdivided as described below.

### Series 1: Orchestral Manuscripts

These documents constitute the musical legacy emanating from Herman Rudin's pen, whether original works or arrangements and transcriptions. They are subdivided as follows:

### Sub-series A: Original Compositions by Herman Rudin

In this sub-series, Mr. Rudin's original works are represented in manuscript form. Nearly all of them are represented in both scores and parts.

#### Sub-series B: Arrangements and Transcriptions by Herman Rudin

Here, Mr. Rudin's arrangements and transcriptions of works by other composers are represented in manuscript form. Nearly all of them are represented in both scores and parts. For local interest, the selection of works is noteworthy for its inclusion of a composition by Rochesterian violinist David Hochstein.

### Series 2: Music by Others

This series is comprised of published scores and other volumes that contributed to Mr. Rudin's study of the violin as well as his score study as a student of orchestral conducting. It is subdivided into three sub-series, namely volumes annotated by Mr. Rudin, unannotated volumes, and miniature scores. The first two sub-series primarily contain method books and solos for violin or viola, whereas the miniature scores are almost exclusively of orchestral works.

Sub-series A: Annotated by Herman Rudin

Sub-series B: Miscellaneous and Unannotated

Sub-series C: Miniature Scores

### Series 3: Biographical Material and Ephemera

These documents are subdivided into the following four sub-series:

#### Sub-series A: Programs

This sub-series consists of printed concert programs, the bulk of them being of the RPO, and which are arranged chronologically by decade.

### Sub-series B: Correspondence

This sub-series consists of letters and notes to or from colleagues of Mr. Rudin.

### Sub-series C: Ephemera

This sub-series consists of diverse documents bearing either a tangential or direct connection to Mr. Rudin's work.

#### Sub-series D: Newspaper Clippings

This sub-series consists of press items largely bearing on the RPO, and all of which are arranged chronologically by decade.

#### Series 4: Photographs

The photographs depict a rich cross-section of the life of the Rochester Philharmonic orchestra throughout the years of Mr. Rudin's association with the orchestra. The subjects include all of the music directors under whom he played or else whom he served in an administrative capacity; guest artists who appeared as soloists with the orchestra; other guest artists who appeared in Rochester as soloists in their own right; shots of RPO rehearsals; and shots of milestone events in the life of the orchestra. Some of the photographs were presentation items, inscribed by their subjects to Mr. Rudin. Two oversized photographs were received framed in presentation format; in consideration of their size and format, the framed items have been stored in the Vault's Artwork Storage.
